


Why wait for the law to make these new brakes a "must"?



Why did the Rambler stop when the other car couldn't? This test, supervised by the Metropolitan Public Safety Dept., Dade County, Miami, Florida, shows the dramatic difference between Rambler's Double-Safety Brakes and other brakes, in case of damage.

First, paper barriers were set up a few feet beyond stop signs. Then, mechanics simulated brake damage by cutting a hydraulic line in each of two standard production-line cars—a 1962 Rambler and a 1962 competitor's car. Both cars then drove side-by-side toward the barriers. On signal, both drivers slammed on their brakes.

Result: the Rambler stopped; the competitive car crashed through the barrier.

If one is damaged, the other works

You see, Rambler's new Double-Safety Brake System has tandem master cylinders, with one hydraulic system for front brakes, and one for rear brakes. They work together... but if one becomes damaged, the other still operates!

What these new brakes are worth in an emergency cannot be measured in dollars. Yet, they're standard equipment on all 1962 Ramblers. Someday all cars may be so equipped. Right now, no other U.S. car except Cadillac has them at all.
