This blue bomb, which is seldom beaten on the quarter-mile strips of the West Coast, started out in life as a Shelby GT-350 Mustang but later became the pilot machine for the

GT-350 racing program. Just prior to the 1965 AHRA Nationals in Long Beach, the then white GT-350 of Mel Burns' Ford in Long Beach was delivered to Performance Associates for a complete reworking. The amount of work required to revamp the car for the strip doesn't look like much on paper, but it is the "little" things that can make or break a drag machine.

The 289-inch mill in the GT-350 record-holder is almost stock Shelby. A completely set up minimum-clearance engine, the heads are legal AHRA running 1% and 1% valves and a compression ratio of 11.5-to-1. The dual valve springs are from Isky and the intake system is the standard Shelby high-rise 715-cfm Holley four-barrel.

The camshaft is the same unit that Performance Associates has been using in their 260/289 Fords. The stick is known as the "Sully cam, and what it

does to a little Ford engine is almost unbelievable! Strange as it sounds, it is a stock Ford cam—that is, if you have the right parts book. For the record, it was designed specifically for 260/289 Fords with the single 4-barrel Holley carb which is flow-rated at 715 cfm. This camshaft, available from Performance Associates and Shelby American, is listed as the S1-CR-6250 "Cobra Race Cam." It has a full half-inch life and red-lines at 7500

rpm. The engine was rehashed by PA for the cam. Everything from the ignition curve to the length of the exhaust was reworked. The carburetor was also re-jetted.

The power is transmitted to the rear wheels via a PA-modified T-10 transmission with a modified Hurst shift linkage. The rear end is fitted with PA lift bars, plus a Ford third member with

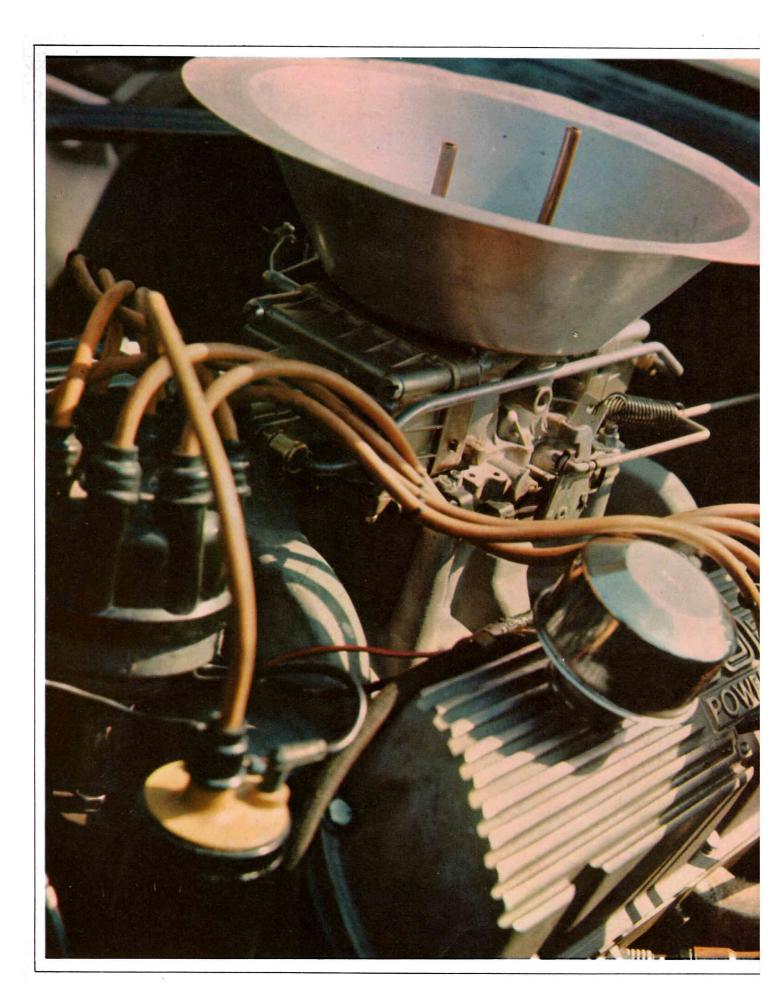
